INSTRUCTORS

Gary L. Burns is a 27 year career teacher. As a content reading facilitator for the district, he began his odyssey with the Apple computer in the early 70s with the original Apple II. Employed as a technology teacher specialist before coming to the Hughes Center with the School for Computer Professions, he has also been an active inservice instructor for educators for the last 20 years. He was a consultant for the State of Ohio Title IV programs, and in 1988 was selected to attend Dartmouth College Computer Literacy (CLIPP) program. He holds secondary certificates in English, biology and computer science and has completed graduate work in educational technology.

Marilyn K. Burns is an interdisciplinary lead teacher. Her 16 years of experience began in SLD. Currently she is a language arts teacher at Schwab. She has used computers in her English/reading program for the last six years while doing educator inservice for computers and the middle school experience. A Dartmouth CLIPP participant, she has presented nationally at the Nuts and Bolts Conference in Boulder, Colorado, and the 1995 AFTQuEST conference held in Washington, DC. She also serves as a TREK consultant for Quality Schools. She holds elementary, reading and computer science certificates. Her masters is in special education from Xavier University.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

The course is open to all subject area teachers. Familiarity with the Macintosh computer is helpful but not necessary.
